Abstract and Paper Submission

The conference committee selection panel will consider all abstracts received by the published deadline to ensure the proposed submission is relevant to the conference. Papers that are accepted will be published in the conference proceedings, provided at least one author completes registration (including payment).

Abstract selection notifications will be sent out to relevant authors within 3 weeks of receipt and no later than April 30, 2020.

Final papers will be included in a **co-authored monograph** after undergoing double-blind peer review by members of the conference committee and, if necessary, by external reviewers to ensure they meet an appropriate standard of quality and that the proposed subject of the submitted paper has been followed.

The final paper should not exceed 8000 words, including tables, references, figure captions and footnotes. The paper should be prepared according to the Harvard referencing style. More information at: <u>https://www.peterlang.com/page/104</u>

The paper structure must adhere to the following order: title; abstract (250 words); keywords (4-6); main text introduction, main chapters, conclusion; acknowledgments; declaration of interest statement; references; appendices (as appropriate); table(s) with caption(s) (on individual pages); figures; figure captions (as a list).

For authors whose first language is not English, we request that you have your work proofread prior to submission by a native English speaker (or at least a fluent English speaker). Papers may be rejected due to an insufficient level of English.

The monograph including final papers will be published with an ISBN and ISSN through Jagiellonian University Press or Peter Lang Publishing.
